Public Comment

Disclosure & Disqualification Requirements

Any person or group of persons acting in concert who directly or indirectly contribute \$1,000 or more in support of or in opposition to a change of organization or reorganization that has been submitted to Modoc LAFCO must comply with the disclosure requirements of the Political Reform Act of 1974 applicable to local initiative measures to be submitted to the electorate. These requirements contain provisions for making disclosures of contributions and expenditures at specified intervals; they may be reviewed at Government Code §\$56700.1 and 81000 et seq. Additional information about the requirements pertaining to local initiative measures to be presented to the electorate can be obtained by calling the Fair Political Practices Commission at (916) 322-5660. A LAFCO Commissioner must disqualify herself or himself from voting on an application involving an "entitlement for use" (such as an annexation or sphere amendment) if, within the last twelve months, the Commissioner has received \$250 or more in campaign contributions from the applicant, any financially interested person who actively supports or opposes the application, or an agency (such as an attorney, engineer, or planning consultant) representing the applicant or an interested party. The law (Government Code Section 84308) also requires any applicant or other participant in a LAFCO proceeding to disclose the contribution amount and name of the recipient Commissioner on the official record of the proceeding. 2. Approval of the Agenda (Additions and Deletions)

The August 8th minutes were reviewed by the members present and a motion was made by Commissioner Nelson and seconded by Commissioner Coe. The Minutes were unanimously appoved.

- Appointment of a Public Member and Public Member alternate for LAFCo

The Commission considered appointment of a public member. Laurie Pearce Price was introduced and gave the Commission her background. Ned Coe asked Laurie if she was an employee or officer of any local government in Modoc County. Laurie responded no longer employed by any public entity. Commissioner Nelson made the motion and Commissioner Minchella seconded and unanimously approved. John Benoit explained how the elections for a public member are conducted. Laurie Pearce Price was appointed by a unaminous vote of the Commission.

John Benoit explained Nikki French was interested in becoming the public member alternate. The Commission determined it would be appropriate she be invited to the next LAFCo meeting to be considered by the Commission.

5. Consider Minutes for the August 8, 2023 LAFCo meeting

The LAFCo minutes for the August 8, 2023 meeting reviewed. Upon motion of Commissioner Coe and seconded by Commissioner Starr, the minutes were adopted

Ned Coe had a comment regarding the dark headings on the Spreadsheet. The payment of claims for August 2023 and September 2023 was moved by Commissioner Coe and seconded by Commissioner Shane approved by a unanimous vote of the Commission

8. Progress Report: Alturas Service Review and Sphere of Influece Update

John Benoit gave a brief presentation of the upcoming Alturas Municipal Service Review and Sphere of Influence update. There was a general discussion regarding items of importance to be included in the Municipal Service Review and Sphere of Influence. A workshop will most likely take place at the December 12, 2023 LAFCo meeting. John Benoit explained he had excellent participation from the City departments. He also explained the importance of median Household Income Data being 80% less than the State median Household Income. Also the RWQCB is under new legislation for water storage. He discussed a proposed Taxpayer Protection Act in November 2024 which will have some impact upon city annexations especially those that are inhabited. Commissioner Nelson indicated the population in the city is declining.

9. Canby CSD and Canby Fire Merger

There was a Discussion of basic LAFCo Requirements. Bonnie Sherer gave a status report of the application to be filed with LAFCo and indicated the revised joint resolution would be approved within a few days by both the Canby CSD Board and the Canby Fire Protection District Board.

John Benoit indicated the application would be processed when the signed joint resolution are submitted to LAFCo and if received we could have a December 12th, 2023 public hearing.

The new "Canby Area Community Services District" would have Fire, Domestic Water, Parks and Recreation and lighting. Wastewater may be later and be much more difficult to implement and operate. Can establish "benefit zones" which would include special services areas.

The district will need to prepare a service plan and financial plan in addition to a metes and bounds descriptions.

10. Executive Officer's Report
